- **Individual A.A. Members** - are also invited to become P.I. Service Workers to perform the same activities. (This commitment has the same responsibilities & time criteria as the P.I. Group Representative.) We also invite AA members with 90 days of sobriety to assist the Group Representatives & Service Workers.
